Hidden Stories



Supported by Leeds City Council

Hidden Stories shines a spotlight on the real stories that our city is built on. It's an opportunity for Leeds to shout to the world about our stories and the people that make our city. Heritage is within all of us, it's the tales we tell, the food we make, and the songs we sing. It's what makes our city so special.

This year, Hidden Stories is bringing a fresh perspective to the stories of Leeds that have previously been overlooked and under-celebrated. We're working with communities across our city to uncover the extraordinary heritage that is right here in Leeds.



Milim has been engaging with members of the Jewish community to produce Meet Me at Cantors, a new theatre production exploring the joy and social lives of Leeds's Jewish teenagers in the 1950's. This new show premieres on the 10th September and is inspired by interviews with some of Leeds's older Jewish residents for whom Cantor's fish and chip shop was the place to be.

Meanwhile, Gill Crawshaw's 'Any Work That Wanted Doing' exhibition launches on the 8th September at Leeds Industrial Museum sees nine disabled artists create new work inspired by Gill's

research into the heritage of disabled textile workers.



Lens Lab Project has spent the last year working closely with communities from the six most represented faiths in our city to gather stories and capture portraits of people and place within these thriving communities.

This exhibition brings together the result of capturing conversations and making photographs, revealing the extraordinary diversity of people's everyday lives in the heart of our city's faith communities and is on show from 17th September.

Thackray Museum of Medicine and Sable Studios have teamed up to create Culture Club! A weekly youth group, where 16-21-year-olds, can explore healthcare and medical histories through different media such as photography, music, and video. Join them on Friday 8th September for a free evening of workshops, talks, exhibitions, food, music and works curated by the young people of Culture Club.

Discover hidden stories of gender at another of Leeds's leading museums, the Royal Armouries Museum, through a project designed and produced by local LGBTQ+ people. The exhibition and trail 'Forgotten Battles: Gender in the Armouries' opens on the 7th September and builds on new research into the Armouries collections to reclaim the museum as an LGBTQ+ space.

We've also partnered with Leeds Civic Trust to help organisations across the city to put on **Heritage Open Day** events which celebrate and showcase local heritage.

You'll be able to discover more about the project during Heritage Open Days at the Hidden Stories Hub in Leeds Corn Exchange. Here you can see talks, exhibitions, and events. and find out more about activities taking place across Leeds throughout this festival of history and culture.

A cinema unwrapped



After three years of closure, the Hyde Park Picture House has finally reopened. Thanks to the support of the National Lottery Heritage Fund and Leeds City Council, we've been able to put heritage at the heart of the project.

Highlights have included the restoration of our characterful red and white façade. On investigation, the parapet at the top was found to be leaning slightly, the stonework had worn in places and water ingress had caused cracking of our beautiful Burmantofts faience tiles.

The parapet was made safe through careful reassembly, brick by brick, and installation of new steel supports. We worked with the experts at Darwen Terracotta to carefully replicate the most damaged sections of our tiled entranceway, and the weathered stonework was rebuilt.

Inside the building one of the most stunning reveals of the project saw us peel away layers of burgundy carpet and bold red and blue checked vinyl tiles to discover the original terrazzo floor in our foyer. A marvellous field of cold grey flecks of stone, mottled with subtle blues, greens, and even yellow and coral. Hidden for decades, this beautiful feature is now out on show, inviting audiences to wonder about the generations who have traversed it.

Whilst works were underway we continued to enjoy Heritage Open Days through online screenings, walking tours around New Briggate, zoetrope workshops at the Leeds Industrial Museum and archive film shows at the oldest church in Leeds city centre.



We loved these experiences but the words "There's no place like home" ring in our ears as we settle back into the building, forming the inspiration behind our 2023 Heritage Open Days plans.



Bramley Baths

At the heart of its community since

1904, Bramley Baths is the last remaining Edwardian bath house in Leeds. Built to improve public health and well-being in response to the outbreak of cholera, Bramley Baths was one of eight public bath houses in the city. Local residents came to wash, swim and use the Russian Steam Baths. fashionable with the wealthier


Edwardians as a healthy pastime.

Originally built for the Globe Foundry owned by William Bottomley in the 1870s, the iconic foundry chimney, built from 8000 Kirkstall bricks, still towers over the baths today and can be seen for miles around.

Life has changed over the last 119 years, and whilst it might look much the same as its early days, with its original oak reception box, steam room, and stained glass windows, Bramley Baths has moved with the times. During the Depression of the late 1920s, the baths were emptied and filled with water and bleach every fortnight. So the cheapest swim- if not the cleanest - was usually on the day the pool was emptied! A water filtration system was introduced in the 1930s and today

the Baths uses a hyprolizer to convert salt into chlorine on site. The pool was drained in winter months to cut heating costs but instead of closing a dance floor was built, allowing the Baths to continue as social hub for the community even in the toughest times.

The transformation was permanent during World War II (1939-1945) becoming a much loved tradition continuing well into the 1960s with the baths being well known across the city for its dances.





Generations have learned to swim, bathed, danced, raced, and worked at Bramley Baths. It is more than a pool - it is a special place in people's lives and histories.

Community support continues to preserve its past, deliver its present and help secure its future for generations to come.

Bramley Baths remained a constant in local life, and following restoration in the late 80s, was reopened in the early 90s. When Leeds City Council invited expressions of interest to take over its management due to increased running costs. a passionate group of local residents and organisations joined forces to devise a business plan. campaign and fundraising. By January 2013 the Friends of Bramley Baths had successfully saved their precious community asset, establishing the thriving not for profit organisation it is today.

Leeds Beckett University

From 8-17 September 2023, Leeds Beckett University will open its doors with an exciting programme of events for Heritage Open Days 2023, England's largest community led festival of history and culture. Leeds Beckett takes great pride in its rich heritage and its integral role within the community. As part of Heritage Open Days 2023, the university's programme features creative writing workshops, a history of visual technologies in Leeds, walking tours that will allow

participants to discover the history and evolution of the Leeds music scene and venues, a fanzine workshop and more.

Today Leeds Beckett

is located across two campuses in Leeds city centre and at Headingley. The university was founded with The Leeds Mechanic Institute which was established in 1824 and was once housed in what is now the Leeds City Museum. The origins of Headingley Campus can be traced back further.

to the Cistercian monks of Kirkstall Abbey during the mid-12th century. It passed through the hands of William Beckett, a landowner and banker from Leeds, before eventually becoming the City of Leeds Training College in 1913.

While the university's affiliation with Headingley Campus extends back more than a century, the estate itself has been a prominent landmark in Leeds for even longer.



The oldest building on Headingley Campus, The Grange, has stood since 1626 and formed part of the temporary hospital that was based on the estate during the outbreak of World War I. As an institution, both history and looking to the future is important at Leeds Beckett and

we continue to make a positive different both locally and globally. Leeds Beckett has a track record of preparing students for the future, with graduates playing a vital role in driving the economic growth and prosperity of Leeds and beyond.

Sunny Bank Mills & Archive

from Dogstooth to Birdseye

What makes a cudbear? How can a twill thrill? Discover the intriguing designs involved in the making of Woodhouse's fine worsted cloth created at Sunny Bank Mills.



Dating from 1829, Sunny Bank Mills was an important woollen and worsted mill, with an interesting history. It is still owned by the Gaunt family who helped found the mill in late Georgian times. The unique collection at Sunny Bank Mills Archive will be open all weekend, containing a complete record of cloth samples woven at the mill since the 1880s: an inspiration for all.

The atmospheric mills still contain artefacts to take you back in time to the days it employed over 900 people spinning and weaving some of the finest cloth in the world.

Drop into the Archive and see how we unwrap creativity by examining the skill of the designer from brief to catwalk.

An opportunity to see how the designers created innovative and artistic designs and weave for cloth destined for around the world. If you can't make it to the Archive for this special weekend, you can explore our unique collection through an exciting virtual tour of the site and a 360-degree experience of the Archive.

Outside In at Temple Newsam



On 19 October 1923, Temple Newsam was officially opened to the public after being purchased by the City of Leeds a year before.

This provided the people of Leeds with one of the largest public parks in Europe for exercise and recreation, and an awe-inspiring historic country house to explore.

To mark the 100th anniversary of public ownership, three artists People Powered Press. Diana Beltran Herrera and Paul Ratcliff have created unique artworks which highlight some of the most recognisable features of Temple Newsam House. These interventions also celebrate the nature, sights, and sounds of Temple Newsam's amazing

outdoors, bringing the outside, in. A small display in the Book Room also charts the sometimes dramatic changes that have occurred in the last century.

DIANA BELTRAN HERRERA: FOREVER SPRING

Temple Newsam is a valuable habitat for many species of birds and numerous varieties are featured in the elaborate wallpaper of the house. Bristol-based Colombian artist Diana Beltran Herrera has drawn inspiration from the historic wallpaper to create a Chinese wallpaper in three dimensions. Her creations are made entirely of paper, so they are delicate and fragile - a fitting metaphor for the precarious state of the natural world today.

PAUL RATCLIFF: BRINGING THE OUTSIDE IN

Temple Newsam's Picture Gallery is one of the greatest rooms in Britain. Its design is based upon nature and the outside world. Paul Ratcliff has installed an immersive soundscape to reference this impressive space. It has been carefully stitched together from field recordings taken around the estate. It highlights not only the importance of Temple Newsam as a habitat for wildlife but also its role in allowing the public to be amongst nature.

PEOPLE POWERED PRESS: WITHIN WITHOUT

Temple Newsam's rooftop inscription is one of its most recognisable and memorable features. The words, 'HEALTH AND PLENTY BE WITHIN THIS HOUSE' have been used as the focus of these artworks. The artworks were co-created with Leeds Stitch & Textile. People Poetry, and People Powered Press.



Pablo Fanque

175 years ago this year, a terrible accident occurred in Leeds that has gone down in local history. Late in the evening of March the 18th 1848, during a performance of Pablo Fangue's circus in King Charles Croft, the pit and gallery of the wooden circus building collapsed. The building was plunged into darkness and the panicking people scrambled to escape into the surrounding narrow streets. Pablo Fangue went back into the building and discovered the only fatality of the night - his wife. She was buried a few days later and it was reported in the local newspapers that over 10,000 people lined the streets of Leeds to view the cortege as it passed on its way to Woodhouse cemetery, now known as St George's Fields.

But what made Pablo Fanque so well respected?

He was the first Black circus owner in Britain and was an icon of the black communities of the time, as much as he is today. But his story, and the stories of other BAME performers, have been pushed to the margins of history and now, in Leeds, we have the opportunity to recognise and celebrate the life of Pablo Fangue.

Fanque was born William Darby in a Norwich workhouse in 1810. At an early age, he went to work for William Batty's circus. It is likely that, like many other nineteenth-century



children, he was apprenticed to the circus owner. With Batty, he learned his craft and became an accomplished Leaper (acrobat), Rope dancer (tightrope walker), and Equestrian. At what point he took the performing name Pablo Fanque, and why, is not known. Perhaps he took the name to make him sound more exotic?



He remained with Batty for several years but towards the close of 1841 he had plans. In January 1842 he presented his own circus in Warrington for the first time, as reported in the Manchester Times of 8th January.

By now he was well respected and recognised as a performer so his new venture drew a large crowd.

In the following years he performed widely in the north of England, especially in the central northern corridor from Liverpool in the west to Hull in the east.

He was very popular and well respected, especially in Leeds, often giving performances for orphans and workhouse children.

When he died in 1875, he left instructions for his body to be returned to Leeds to lie alongside the body of his first wife.

You can visit their graves today in at Leeds General Cemetery.

The winning 13 entries have now formed the months of a 2024 calendar and its front page that is now available for pre-order.













Searching on a deskstop? Advanced Search:

When you visit the Heritage Open Days website head to the top menu bar and hover over 'Visit' and then go down to 'Search' and click.

The screen will open a new page: Advanced Search



Here you will be able to search for events that are listed in the booklet.

To find more information on a specific events use **keywords**.

In keywords type in the event title, for example, 'Curator Tours of the Outside In Exhibition'

- In Counties select 'West Yorkshire'
- In Towns select 'Leeds'
- In 'local council areas' select Leeds

Then hit the search button to see the results!

If there are multiple events at one location you can type the site name in the keywords.

For example 'Leeds Central Library' this will list all the events happening at that location.

Searching on a mobile?

We have placed a QR code throughout the booklet to take you straight to the Heritage Open Days website.

The Heritage Open Days website appears differently on a mobile to a desktop.

When you scan the QR code follow these three simple steps to find the event details you want:

- Click the menu button (three lines)
- Click Visit, a page titled 'Visiting Go explore!' Will open.
- Scroll down to the 'Design your day' search tool.
- In 'Town' select 'Leeds'
- In 'County' select 'West Yorkshire'
- Then add your keywords
- To view all Leeds listings do not add any keywords.

Keywords are the best way to find a specific event.

There are many different ways to search for events, including, date, time, online etc.
